# **Broadland Community First Responders News**

Happy New Year from Broadland Community First Responders — what a year we had in 2024 and the figures are now in. We cover mainly the area bordered by Eccles, Stalham, North Walsham and around to Trimingham and in that area we were called by the Ambulance service to over 300 calls which are calls requiring a blue light ambulance. Sometimes we would be on scene for 2 -3 minutes before the crew arrived and others 2 – 3 hours depending on the pressure. We start 2025 with 4 new volunteers joining the team so we can offer even more hours of availability. Last year we were available for over 7000 hours between us.

We have to fund raise for some of our kit and one of the big events is our annual plant sale on Saturday May 10<sup>th</sup> at Walcott Village Hall. We will be very grateful for any plant donations and anything that we can sell on our "middle aisle" tables so if you are having a spring clean before May 10<sup>th</sup> and have anything you are willing to donate please contact George on george@vistatraining.co.uk and he can arrange collection.
